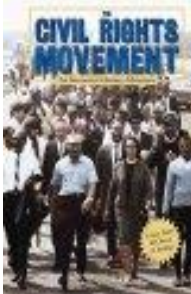

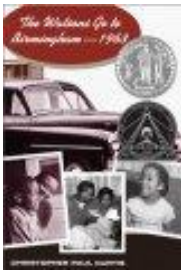


The Civil Rights Movement: An Interactive History Adventure

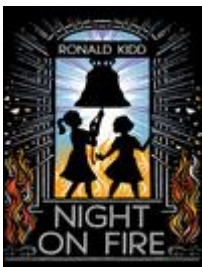


A Sky Full of Stars

Billie has never really understood why things are segregated in Anniston, Alabama. Then the Freedom Riders come through town and her perception of everything, including herself, changes.

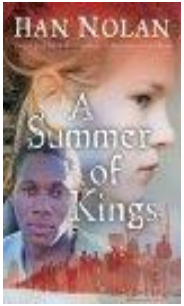


The Rock and the River

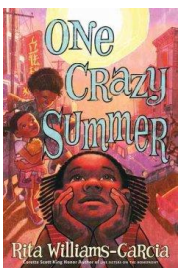


Revolution
