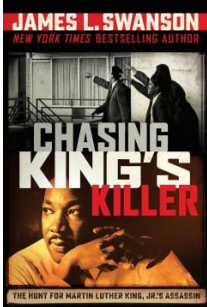

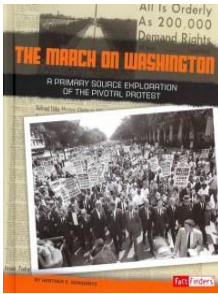


Chasing King's Killer: The Hunt for Martin Luther King, Jr.'s Assassin

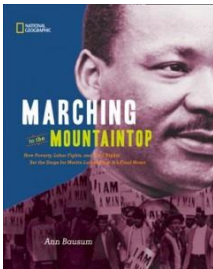


The March on Washington

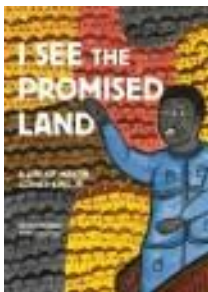

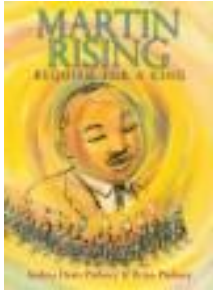

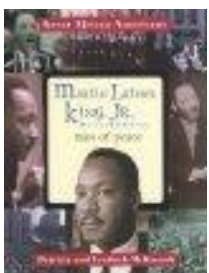
